2013 Participation Incentive Program Rewards Loyal Rallyists

It's no secret that attendance at our First Friday Niter series has been on the decline. Where once we could expect to see 15-20 cars any given month, we now find entries of fewer than ten cars to be the norm (and in November, we had only six.) The high price of gas is almost certainly a factor in this drop, as is the everincreasing number of activities that compete for your time.

However, there is still a group of dedicated rallyists who show up month after month, and it is their continued participation that is the lifeblood of the FFN series. To say thank you to these regular entrants (and as a way to encourage the rest of you to BECOME regular entrants!) SMSCC is proud to announce the 2013 Participation Incentive Program. Beginning with the January 4th FFN, you will be able to earn free rally entries and rally bucks in three different ways:

- 1. Buy 4, Get 1 Free. It's as simple as it sounds: buy four regular-priced Friday Niter entries, get a fifth for free. With your first paid entry of the year, we'll give you a punch card. Get your card punched each time you enter, and redeem for a free entry after your fourth punch.
- 2. Novice Class Graduation Gift. After running in Class D ten times (or winning the class three times) you're required to move up to Class C. To make this transition a bit less intimidating, we'll pay the entry fee for your first rally in your new class. Don't worry if you don't know how many times you've run Class D...we keep good records, and we'll let you know!
- 3. Rally Bucks for Referrals. You, our loyal rallyists, are the best advertising our club could ask for, and we want you to tell your friends about us! So, if a first-time entrant writes your name on the "How Did You Hear About Us?" line on the entry form, both you AND your friend will receive a Rally Buck after that night's rally.

(Note: "Free Entry" refers to the SMSCC portion of entry fees. We are still required to collect weekend membership fees for the SCCA.)

We have some exciting rallies planned for 2013, and we hope to see more of you on course this year. And as always, your feedback on ways we can improve the FFN program is always welcome!

SMSCC 2013 Rally Series

SMSCC's Rally Series is back! We will be presenting a series of day rallies:

INAUGURAL is February 16. It will be a trap rally, about 4 hours, written by Sam Weissen.

THE SPRING CLASSIC is April 27. Patrick Strong is writing a tour rally highlighting many of the 'fun to drive' roads in the Santa Monica mountains.

NOT MY FAULT is June 15. The rally will be a tour with the same format as last year's Not My Fault. Joanna Weissen is again the rallymaster. Which earthquake fault will she feature this year?

EUREKA is September 21. It will have traps, and will probably be about 5 hours. Rallymaster Jeanne English will likely take the rally into the foothills of the Antelope Valley.

And finally, Larry Scholnick will be writing a gimmick rally (like a trap rally but without speed changes or timing checkpoints). The date is November 2, the name is still to be determined.

There will be a series championship; you get points for each rally you run. Plus, if you run checkout or work one of the rallies you get points equal to your best finish. If you know you will be unable to run a particular rally (or don't want to run it), come run checkout. You will learn a lot, and there's no timing pressure.

Points will be based upon your finishing position in class, and we will be using the same point system that SCCA uses for its rallies. Points are awarded as follows:

For classes in which only one car is entered, there are several items of interest: classes must be declared when registering for the rally, and may then be changed only once; for trophies, we will do as we do for the FFNs – the single car must beat the next lower class to get a trophy; for results reported to SCCA, the single car will be scored with the next higher class; for points in our Rally Series, if the single car does not beat the next lower class, that car will be combined with the next lower class by factoring the scores (B=1.0, C=0.7, D=0.5) and given points equal to position in class, but not displacing any of the lower class cars (e.g. 1st C, 2nd C, 3rd B, 3rd C, 4th C – in this example, the single B car would have been 3rd in class C and thus gets 3rd place points, but does not displace the 3rd place car in class C.)

Hamburger Lane for Never by Larry Scholnick

Although every Rallymaster seeks perfection, few achieve it; too often there is a minor inconsistency that necessitates a correction in the True Time for a leg. Sometimes a misworded route instruction is discovered at the start and corrected before anyone is misled by the errant RI. On the December FFN, the biggest mistake was the placement of the final checkpoint on a minor industrial street known as Hamburger Lane, which traverses the 'campus' of In N Out University, the training center for the In N Out hamburger chain in Baldwin Park. On Friday nights, this usually deserted road becomes the primary thoroughfare from Baldwin Park Blvd to Store #1, the very first In N Out Burger location.

Most First Friday Niters head to what have become the traditional stomping grounds of SMSCC, southwest into the Santa Monica mountains, west into Ventura County, north into the Santa Clarita Valley, or southeast into the foothills of Glendale or Pasadena. Rarely has a FFN headed farther east into the heart of the San Gabriel Valley. The Odo Check headed southeast on I-210 to the Mount Olive exit in Duarte. The first leg took contestants through Duarte, Irwindale and Azusa to a checkpoint on an industrial street in Azusa where the Lined Road inexplicable turned from Sierra Madre Blvd to Mountain View Circle (the checkpoint road); to do the leg correctly required following the Lined Road directly into the checkpoint, forgoing several other route instructions.

Leg 2 put you *Onto* Arrow Highway, where some contestants soon noticed that Arrow Highway veered to the right and another road (Live Oak) went straight ahead. Checkpoint 2 was on a dead-end street in Baldwin Park in an area where the street signs were on the same posts as the stop signs.

After a U-turn directed by the checkpoint handout, contestants were confronted with a WOF instruction, L at Signal or L at Stop. There was a Stop sign just past the Out

Marker, why not use that? Answer: Because it was on the same post as the sign for the checkpoint road, which you had used to get to the checkpoint. The Generals preclude you from using the same sign for two consecutive numbered route instructions, and declare that all signs on a common support are considered to be a single sign.

Leg 3 also featured a speed change at " ... To do this instruction correctly you had to ignore the one that was on your left as you entered the freeway, and continue at a slower speed on the freeway for a mile until you found an identical sign that was on your right.

Leg 4 featured the full length of Turnbull Canyon Road, which connects Hacienda Heights with uptown Whittier. The final leg followed Workman Mill Road as it zigged and zagged. During part of the route the contestants were searching for a pause at each "CROSSROADS PKY", only to discover that some signs were on the left, others were missing some letters (CROSSRDS PKY), and one had an extra letter (CROSSROADS PKWY); I guess that's why some claim that trap rallies are too picky. The rally finished at one of the few remaining Pizza Hut restaurants that is not limited to Take-Out and Delivery, and the only one I've found to stay open until 1 AM on Fridays and Saturdays.
