They found me a supervisor who said, "The onramp is closed because we are moving supplies and equipment and we don't want any of our workers to be hit by a car - but I'm planning on opening the ramp up in a few minutes." Whew! Crisis averted, onramp open.

I then go to the start, things are going fine, I leave to run preview. Get to the end of the odo check, things are still going fine. A few instructions later I approach the first checkpoint location and – oops! The checkpoint is located along the curb in front of a school. It's 8:00 pm on a Friday night – and the parking lot and curb are full of cars! The workers set up as best they could, and I continue on running preview. The crew later tells me that almost immediately after I left, the parking lot and curb clear out – and the spot once more becomes an ideal checkpoint location. Good timing!

Not done yet – continuing ahead the rally is heading out into the canyon roads, and as I approach one of the turns I see a lot of sheriff and CHP vehicles and some barricades. What now? Seems it's a sobriety checkpoint! I continue making my turn (hoping no one comes after me

thinking I was trying to avoid their checkpoint) and find out later that they were finished and were closing up. Another crisis averted!

Fortunately, the rest of the rally had no hitches, and we all got to enjoy our chocolate cake at the finish. Thanks to all who were there to help me celebrate!

June FFN – The rally was primary a fun drive on the canyon roads using tulip instructions. Many of the instructions included an FLR and it only mattered on the first leg. There was a lettered instruction to pause at "English Ivy Ln". It could not be executed because at the time you saw the sign, you had not yet found the lined road to complete the previous numbered instruction which was 'L at T. FLR.' Since you hadn't completed the numbered instruction the lettered instruction was not yet active. And by the way – this was at least partially done because on the May FFN a similar situation occurred, and we (SMSCC) had missed it. But Revere Jones caught it! Hope you catch it this month, too!

El Camino Real XXX – This was a PCA rally running in the Santa Barbara area, and had some really nice roads, including one that I am pretty sure I had not been on before. There were no traps, but it became a challenge to stay on time in some places – lots of traffic and speeds often at the speed limit and not enough pauses. The rally ended at a nice Mexican restaurant.

Rich Paré Memorial Rally – This was another PCA rally, but this time running in the Antelope Valley. on roads that I like to use for my own rallies. This time there were traps. One of them I think the rallymasters stole from me! There was a checkpoint part way down a long road that dead-ends. The handout said to go to the end of the road to make a U-turn to get to the out marker. There was, of course, an out marker at the end of the road, but there was also one fairly close to the checkpoint for those who didn't think they had to go all the way to the end of the road to U-turn. When I have done this, on the same road, I had the checkpoint closer to the beginning of the road and three out markers for contestants to choose from with only the one at the end of the road being the correct choice. What's the saying? Imitation is the sincerest form of flattery? Thanks Revere Jones and Tom Gould!
