### Stopped for speeding? Blame it on Henry Lee Higginson

In the early years of the 20th century, automobiles in the United States were governed by few laws, and those on the books were, at best, loosely enforced. Tired of scofflaws breaking the 15 mile per hour speed limit near his summer estate, Boston businessman Henry Lee Higginson (founder of the Boston Symphony Orchestra) formulated a plan that would ultimately lead to <u>the</u> <u>creation of the modern license plate</u>.

To be clear, New York preceded Higginson's home state of Massachusetts in requiring license plates for motorized vehicles. New York, however, also required motorists to craft their own license plates, generally using the vehicle owner's initials for identification. The system was haphazard at best, and it's unlikely that cars bearing homemade license plates were easily tied to their owners.

In 1892, a "commission of inquiry" was created to study the state of roads within Massachusetts. Its conclusion would ring true today, as well, resonating with anyone who's driven the U.S. Interstate highway system in the past decade: Roads were in poor condition, and their state would only decline as traffic volume increased. The finding led to the creation of the Massachusetts Highway Commission in 1893, tasked with improving the state of roads within the commonwealth. With its mission defined, the next obstacle became funding; while no one argued that the roads needed to be fixed, no one knew where that funding would come from.

Enter Higginson. Incensed by speeders and careless drivers, Higginson drafted a 1903 petition urging the creation of licensing for both vehicles and drivers. As a man with friends in high places, Higginson's petition quickly led to the creation of an "Automobile Department" within the state, charged with creating and executing a licensing plan for motorists within Massachusetts. A \$2 fee would be assessed to those registering vehicles, and in exchange the commonwealth would issue a state-produced license plate linking car to driver. The first Massachusetts plates were constructed of enameled cast iron, featuring a blue background and a white number.

In the early days of licensing, only numbers were used on license plates. Having a low number indicated that the motorist was an early adopter of the horseless carriage, and thus most likely from a prominent family. In the case of Massachusetts, the very first license plate, bearing the number "1," was issued to Frederick Tudor of Brookline. Coincidentally, Tudor was also an employee of the highway commission, and, by accident of birth, the nephew of Henry Lee Higginson. It's said that a descendant of Tudor still possesses the Massachusetts 1 license plate, which some still view as the ultimate automotive accessory item.

Licensing was implemented in Massachusetts in June of 1903, and mandated by September of the same year. By the end of 1903, Massachusetts amassed nearly \$18,000 in registration fees, the equivalent of almost \$500,000 in 2013. Municipalities also enjoyed a spike in revenue from motor vehicle fines, although the precise amount would be impossible to define.

Had Henry Lee Higginson's 1903 missive entitled "A Petition Relative to Licensing Automobiles and Those Operating the Same" never been drafted, someone else would have surely come along with the idea (which, incidentally, had been implemented for carriages in Victoria, Canada, in 1884). Still, the next time red and blue strobes appear in the rearview mirror, feel free to pin the blame for the points and fine squarely on Higginson and his determination to bring order to motor vehicle chaos.
